

DISCRETIONARY ASSISTANCE FUND (DAF)

The Discretionary Assistance Fund (DAF) in Wales replaces parts of the Social Fund previously run by DWP which you may have known as 'crisis loans' or 'community care grants'. The fund offers grant payments or support for two purposes:

- Individual Assistance Payment for people getting a means tested benefit such as Income Based Job Seekers Allowance, Income Support or Pension Credit, who need help with purchasing goods or services. For example, a cooker, fridge or bed.
- Emergency Assistance Payment For anyone with an immediate threat to health or wellbeing. There is no means assessment for receiving this help



Pupils are entitled to free school transport only if they are: Over the statutory school starting age and under 11 (Primary aged), living over two miles from the nearest appropriate catchment school for their home address.

Secondary age and under the statutory school leaving age of 16, living over three miles from the nearest appropriate catchment school for their home address.

Pupils who qualify for free transport will be able to use contracted school buses, or will be given a free bus pass, which can be used on local commercial bus routes. What is the Team around the Family?

The Team around the Family is a multi-agency approach which is responsible for identifying family members (children and young people and or parents) who are demonstrating a broad variety of needs to stop escalation to statutory services. The Team around the Family tailors provision towards the family's needs, supported by a team of family workers operating on an outreach basis.

Team around the Family Criteria

The following criteria are used to identify where a Team around the Family approach is required:


- The family have a dependent child 0-18 (or 0-25 where vulnerable) who lives in Cardiff or are a family living in Cardiff who are expecting a child.
- The family's needs are multifaceted and can only be met by a coordinated approach involving 4 or more agencies.
- The family's needs are below the thresholds for statutory interventions at tier 3 and 4 for children and adults.

The Families First Freephone number (0333 777 3094) is also managed by the Team around the Family team.

Members of the team are able to provide advice about the best approach when it is unclear whether a family meet the criteria for the full Team around the Family intervention.

Links to other services

- Integrated Family Support Team is a crisis intervention service working with families where there are serious child protection concerns relating to parental/Carer substance misuse
- The Flying Start programme offers support and guidance to families with very young children who live in specified areas of Cardiff. The programme is targeted which are deemed to be the most deprived or disadvantaged families with children under 3 years and 11 months who live in these specified areas are eligible for extra help to get them off to the best start in life. Flying Start supports parents by providing health advice, learning skills support and practical ideas to help them guide their children towards a brighter future.
- Neighbourhood Partnership Teams Within Cardiff the neighbourhood partnership model provides a structure for allowing organisations to work together within local areas. Multi-agency teams based in six localities across Cardiff share local intelligence to solve problems for their particular neighbourhood.
